Strategic Focus: Provide an opportunity for the citizens of Little Rock and visitors from around the world to participate in an efficiently organized, nationally recognized athletic event promoting the City of Little Rock and Little Rock Parks & Recreation, as well as promote health and wellness, encourage friendly competition, while increasing tourism.

Review of 2010 Race

- Voted as one of the top marathon finisher's medals in North America, according to the May/June issue of Marathon & Beyond magazine.
- An economic impact of \$3.4 million. An estimated 1,700 hotel rooms were sold and attributed to the Little Rock Marathon. Many area hotels did not offer a Little Rock Marathon rate and consequently did not track information.
- 23.14% of the field was from outside of Arkansas and 58.3% were from outside Little Rock/North Little Rock.
- 48% of the field was comprised of women, while 42% were men. According to Running USA's breakdown of runner demographics in its 2010 Marathon, Half Marathon and State of the Sport Report (March 28, 2010). According to the report, 41% of the industry's participate field is female and 59% is male.
- 35% of the marathon and half marathon participants called Little Rock their first race, which was a 3% increase from 2009.
- Nancy Green was selected as the **2010 Volunteer of the Year Administration**, by Little Rock Parks & Recreation.
- Total participation (training programs and race registration) grew 4% in 2010. Actual race registrations were up 13% from 2009 registration levels. According to Running USA's 2010 Marathon, Half Marathon and State of the Sport Report (March 28, 2010), the industry was up almost 9.9% from the previous year.

- Still the world's largest finisher's medal (as crowned by Runner's World in 2005). The marathon medal measured 7 3/4 inches by 6 inches and weighed in at 1.67 pounds. According to Maxwell Awards (the world's largest supplier of race medals and awards), the average marathon finisher's medal is approximately 2 ½ inches.
- The final mile of the Little Rockers Kids Marathon, presented by Arkansas Children's Hospital and Today's THV, was a moved from the Arkansas State Capital to the Riverfront Park to maximize resources. More than 1,370 children participated in the final mile, which was a 12% decrease from 2009.
- The Little Rock 5K, presented by Windstream Communications, was moved to Saturday morning to allow families to more easily participate in the weekend's activities. Participation was up 10% from 2009.
- More than 22,000 visitors came through the doors at the Little Rock Marathon Health and Fitness Expo, which was held at the Statehouse Convention Center.

- Over 1,200 participants and spectators attended the Big N Bodacious Post Race Party, which was presented by Whole Hog Café-North Little Rock at the Wally Allen Ballroom in the Statehouse Convention Center.
- The outrageous staff of the Hatcher Agency pampered 770 athletes, 10 members of the media and more than 80 VIPs, which was a 16% increase from 2009.
- An estimated value of \$768,718.65 was contributed by volunteers (36,869 volunteer hours) to stage the 2010 event. The Independent Section (a nonprofit, nonpartisan coalition of the over 600 groups) estimates a volunteer hour at \$20.85.

2010 Race Winners

Leah Thorvilson, 31, of Little Rock, AR won her second consecutive Little Rock Marathon in 2:48:28. Taking second was Michelle Didion, 41 of LaPorte, IN with a time of 3:07:32. Betsy Meacham, 45, of Little Rock, AR took third place with a time of 3:10:16.

Moninda Marube, 31, of Kenya won the men's race in a time of 2:29:40. Benny Rodriguez, 33, of Laredo, TX took second with a 2:33:59 and Kiplimo Chemirmir, 26, of Kenya was third with a 2:34:51.

Participation

The greatest increase in registration was the half marathon, which was a 24% increase from 2009. Marathon registrations were 19% of the total field and increased 10% from 2009. All other events showed increases.

57% of 2010's participants came from outside the area. 24.5% of 2009's participants came outside of Arkansas to participate in this year's race, with the majority coming from Texas, Missouri, Oklahoma, Tennessee and Illinois. The Little Rock Convention & Visitors Bureau estimates the 2009 Little Rock Marathon's economic impact to be approximately \$3.1 million. In addition to the United States, participants came from Canada, China, Ecuador, Ethiopia, France, Germany, Ireland, Japan, Kenya, Mexico, Poland, Portugal, South America, Spain and the United Kingdom.

The average finish time for the marathon was 4:48:21. The average finish time for the half marathon was 2:22:33.

The oldest participant traveled from Somerset, MA. Victor Haddad, 78, finished the marathon is 7:25:49.

The youngest participant was 2 year old Paisley White from Coconut Creek, FL. This was Paisley's third marathon. She was pushed in a stroller by her father Heath White in 3:59:34 (chip time). Paisley and her father were participating in the marathon to bring awareness to Downs Syndrome.
